3 Role purpose: General

- 3.1 To share with the Bishop in the cure of souls.
- 3.2 Ever prayerful and mindful of the responsibilities laid upon you in the Ordinal, the Canons, national Safeguarding policies, and all other relevant legislation, in accordance with the Archbishops' statement *Guidelines for the Professional Conduct of the Clergy*, your ministry will be shaped by the Diocesan vision Seeking, Sharing, Sending and marked by a generosity of spirit, an engagement with the people and situations you serve, and an openness to the promptings of God's love.
- 3.3 Your priestly vocation demands the careful preparation for, and the leading of public worship, the imaginative proclamation of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and the loving service of all God's people entrusted to your care. Together with your priestly colleagues and lay ministers, you will work collaboratively to enable the gifts of all God's people to be developed in the Service of his Kingdom.
- 3.4 In your priestly ministry you will take an active part in the Diocesan strategy Seeking, Sharing, Sending. This will include collaborative parish conversations and planning for mission and ministry as well as working with colleagues across the Deanery and more widely in the life of the Diocese. A number of supports are available to you through the provision of work consultants, spiritual directors and Continuing Ministerial Formation programs, and you will be expected to participate in the scheme of Ministerial Development Review.
- 3.5 Above all, you will remember that we are called to minister by a gracious, generous self-giving and loving God, as together we seek the Kingdom, share the faith, search for truth, serve our neighbour and follow Jesus in his suffering love for the salvation of all people.



Role Purpose - Generic and Specific

- 3.6 To take responsibility for pastoral care, occasional offices and leading of regular public worship in the parish of Benwell & Scotswood.
- 3.7 Strategic oversight of the variety of needs and opportunities across the Team, working with and through others to develop and prioritise the missional response.
- 3.8 To support and resource the existing ministry team and develop the vocations of those already offering lay ministries.
- 3.9 To work with existing systems of governance and finance to enable growth and flourishing and look at developing these further.
- 3.10 To be bold in working with and developing the existing mission partnerships around the church buildings in the parish and be open to exploring new possibilities for both outreach and worship.
- 3.11 To identify and work with the variety of strengths in the congregation and enable growth, spiritually, missionally and numerically
- 3.12 To engage with local schools and develop a plan for closer engagement with the twelve schools across the parish
- 3.13 To be pro-active in ensuring that you continue to access new resources for your ministry and that personal spiritual nurture, refreshment and development is given priority.

5. Role Context

Benwell and Scotswood are dynamic and lively communities with a diversity of cultures within them. The area has relatively large and settled South Asian communities, alongside many people seeking asylum and more traditional white working-class communities The diversity of needs are reflected in the many and varied organisations within the community, many of whom began with local churches.

There has been significant growth in the outreach of the church recently and there is a need to consolidate this and ensure it is sustainable and can continue to grow. There are distinct worship centres across the parish but a growing sense of church communities seeking to worship and serve as one. There has also been some real success in deepening discipleship and engaging people in ministry roles. The nature of the communities mean that the congregations can feel full of life, life-giving and yet fragile requiring a positive yet realistic, robust and yet responsive approach to ministry and mission.
