1. Introduction...

Welcome to the Parishes of Christ Church, Mount Pellon, and St John and St Hilda, Warley!

We invite you to join us as we explore, through this brochure, who we are, our communities and church families and where we feel God is calling us.

As you will see, our churches both have a strong culture of love, care and compassion; we have many overlapping characteristics from our traditions and churchmanship to our emphasis on fellowship and lay leadership. However, our journeys have been on different paths until now - this is a new venture as we seek a path together for the first time in collaboration with a shared Priest-in-Charge. As you read through this, we welcome you to prayerfully consider whether you feel called to join us in what will no doubt be an exciting, challenging and Christ-centred journey!



2. Our Communities...

Halifax is an historic Victorian town in West Yorkshire, in the Diocese of Leeds. Central to the industrial revolution with its then thriving textile industry, it has evolved over the years into a friendly and welcoming corner of Yorkshire, packed with culture and heritage, home to iconic and world-famous sites, and truly offering something for everyone!

At the heart of the town sits the magnificent Grade I listed Georgian cloth hall, Piece Hall, with its atmospheric cafes and bars, local independent shops and creative spaces, which transforms in the summer into a concert venue hosting some of the biggest names in the industry.

In its shadow lies the beautiful 900yr old Halifax Minster, locally known as The Parish Church and the birthplace of many of the churches across the town.

The surrounding countryside of Calderdale and beyond offers endless hours of strolls, hikes, rambling, running and cycling, from the quaint and picturesque villages to the wild and rugged moorland.

For those preferring a warmer and drier view of our region, sit down with a cuppa in front of one of the many dramas filmed locally, including Last Tango in Halifax, Gentleman Jack and Happy Valley!



Our parishes together cover much of the West of urban Halifax, transitioning out to stunning countryside with spectacular views across the moors.

Both have population sizes of just over 10,000 people, with very multicultural and diverse demographics, including large Asian and Muslim communities. Several schools lie within each Parish with whom both Churches have aimed to nurture relationships. Local amenities include supermarkets, post offices, small businesses and places to eat. Regular and reliable bus services connect the Parishes with central Halifax from where there are direct connections to Leeds, Manchester and London.

St John and St Hilda, Warley

The Parish Church building of Warley St John the Evangelist and St Hilda was consecrated in 1878.

The Parish consists of mainly private/residential housing, with a small amount of Housing Association and Sheltered Housing property.

Since St Hilda's church building closed in 2023, the building has been taken fully over for the provision of a Preschool and to provide community rooms but not for religious purposes. The whole of the former St Hilda's parish has transferred to form part of the new St John's and St Hilda parish.

Christ Church, Mount Pellon

We lie to the North West of Halifax, stretching far out over 7.5km, deep into the Calderdale countryside, up to Mount Tabor, Wainstalls and beyond.

Christ Church has been at the heart of the community since 1854 when it served the neighbourhood built up around Webster's Brewery whose founder, Samuel Webster resides in our graveyard.

Despite the beauty within the Parish, there are high levels of unemployment, deprivation and need for free school meals.



3. Our Church Families...

St John and St Hilda, Warley

Our Church Families come from all areas of the parish and outside as well.

Children: Come through Uniformed Organisation groups. Preschool, Mums & Toddlers, Messy Church and Schools Work.

Others: From a wide section of the many communities we seek to serve and come through Parents, Grandparents, Older family members and Single parents/persons attending the church or associated groups.

Our church family has been extended and strengthened through our collaborative working alongside Preschool, Uniformed groups, Mothers Union, Warley Community Association and The Chatty Cafe. This has resulted in a blended church which learns and lives and grows together.

An example of total family involvement arises annually at the local Sowerby Bridge Rushbearing Festival, when Warley is the first Church to Bless the Rushcart and hold an outreach service before the cart moves up the Calder Valley.

Mon: Mums and toddlers, home groups Thurs: Mums and toddlers, Singers Together

Tues: Chatty cafe

Sun: Morning services, Messy Church

Ad hoc/occasional: Open the Book, Social events

This is a new undertaking for both our Parishes – although we share boundaries and have worked together on projects in the past, we have never formally been connected. However, as we've got to know each other in recent months, we're discovering several similar qualities and characteristics.

For both, a desire to empower our Church Families and involve them in direction and decision making is essential. Fellowship, pastoral care and teaching also underpin our ethos, with similar evangelical styles and character



Leadership: Using the many gifts and skills of the leadership team, other members of the PCC and other church members we seek to work collaboratively in supporting the whole body of the church.

Building: We are blessed with a reordered church building (consecrated in 1878) providing an adaptable space for both worship and other activities. In addition at the side of the church is a church hall and meeting rooms (built in 1856) which are in regular daily use. Both buildings have had new boilers installed this year to improve our carbon foot print.

Style: We see ourselves as having a strong Evangelical tradition which encompasses both contemporary and traditional worship.





Mon: Prayer, Home Group, Knit and Natter,

Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, Rangers Weds: Coffee Morning, mid-week Communion,


Thurs: Music group, Listening to God

Building: our church building creates a versatile space to serve our community but, at 170yrs old, requires some work to keep it going with major building works in progress and more needed in the immediate future, to be guided by the forthcoming Quinquennial.

Style: we are evangelical in character with a structure that is flexible and an enthusiasm for trying new things. Our Testimony Slot each Sunday morning brings a sense of anticipation to hear the incredible things God has been doing in our lives and through the week!





4. Mission and Vision...

Both Parishes are committed to sharing the gospel and serving our communities, and already have established links with schools whom we support initiatives through CICS (Christians in Calderdale Schools) and Open the Book, as well as care homes and toddler groups. We also have regular coffee mornings and lunch groups aimed at older members of our communities, and support the work of Diocesan link Parishes in Mara, Tanzania.

Our Mission plan:

To further develop the existing work taking place with Children & Young People and integrate the church more fully within the life of the community.

St John and St Hilda, Warley

Our mission and outreach work takes place with Children and families through Messy Church, links with Uniformed Organisation groups, links with the five day a week Preschool and through the team who take Open the book in to schools.

There are also outreach services held with three residential/nursing homes each month.

Home groups are held weekly in three locations.

Going forward we would hope to strengthen and extend common links within the parish communities and church.

Currently we are looking to find a leader of the 'Singers Together' group with appropriate skills for music/singing in church and on other occasions.

Being in vacancy for more than three years has given us much time to reflect on who we are and where we feel God is calling us. It has been a challenging yet blessed time, one that has been essential for us to strip back, prune, and then grow and nurture new shoots as we look forward to the exciting, fruitful future that God promises us!

We have used this time to better understand ourselves and our community through the Knowing Your Church, Knowing Your Neighbourhood series and our Heritage project which have led us to re-connect with our community through open days, children's work and our fantastic community Graveyard project where, both literally and metaphorically, weeds are beaten back and seeds planted!

Step 1: Identify our needs


PRAYER
